Recap and looking forward

Here's a brief recap of 2021 and prognostication for 2022:

2021— Sales up 9% – Total sales increased 9% over 2020, resulting in our 9th consecutive year of sales growth. The chart continues

to trend upward, confirming solid demand for B&L products and services.

New Software and Features – B&L released a blizzard of Odyssey features and functionality throughout 2021. Gauge Management, a major new module, was released in version 6.3 Q1 with positive reaction from the user community.

New Building – An office expansion project was completed in February 2021 resulting in a more than doubling of office space. A new customer training center was added, along with many connect spaces for employee collaboration sessions, as well as a visitor hospitality area and employee recreation room.

Awarded Titanium Partner with Progress Software – Progress Software Corp (Boston, MA) is the development environment B&L employs for the Data Base and back-end business logic for Odyssey. B&L is proud to have achieved Titanium Business Partner status with Progress Software. Titanium status is the highest level of partner status, with only a small fraction of over 2,000 global business partners achieving this level.

In Person Meetings – As businesses slowly and safely reopened throughout 2021, supported with widespread availability of a vaccine, B&L began re-engaging face-to-face with our customers and prospective customers. An ERP system is a complex thing, and while virtual meetings were a God-send during the heart of the pandemic, and will continue to serve an important purpose, nothing beats in person meetings for effective, two-way communication.

2022— **Implementations** – Whether it's an initial go-live implementation project with a new customer or a Phase 2 project with an existing customer, B&L understands the

importance of providing you with the resources to support your project. We'll continue to make this our #1 priority in 2022.

Innovation – Odyssey ERP will continue to grow and evolve this year, with the vast majority of improvements driven by you, our customers. We listen to you and provide a platform for enhancement suggestions called The Feedback Community. Odyssey is really a reflection of the business software needs of the metal casting industry, refined over 46 years.

Six companies went live with new installations of Odyssey ERP in Q4 2021.

ODYSSEY UPDATE

Odyssey 6.3.1

The past two years have been a challenge for many, but challenges are simply opportunities to overcome. B&L has a growth mindset, which means we will change, improve, and overcome any challenges placed in our path. Serving our customers is B&L's number one priority, which means producing high-quality software that meets and exceeds our customers' needs. As we plan out the future of Odyssey, we cannot only look at today's challenges but also anticipate tomorrow's challenges. This allows Odyssey to change and evolve with time, rather than staying stagnant in the past.

The first step in Odyssey's future is to step away from the past.

Odyssey 6.4.0 is the first Odyssey release that does not include the Windows UI Interface. Released in 2001, the Windows UI is now over 20 years old and is ready for a peaceful retirement. Removing it from the development cycle allows R&D to focus on enhancing and improving the web browser experience, which is the future of all modern ERP applications. We no longer have to manage parallel development systems; we can solely focus on making the web user experience as powerful as possible.

The future of Odyssey also includes many customer enhancements and user-experience improvements, most of which will come directly from our customers through the B&L Community Feedback Forum. The Feedback Forum is the primary source for Odyssey's new features, so please visit the Feedback Forum to vote on your favorite enhancements. All enhancements in the Feedback Forum are worthy of adding to Odyssey, but those that provide the most impact to the most customers are enhancements looked at first. That is why voting for and commenting on enhancements is helpful to Odyssey's product direction.

We all know that smartphones are not going away, and making Odyssey available through a native App was an important milestone. Released last year, the Odyssey App is available as a native iOS app, a native Android app, and through a web browser. The Odyssey App has two main components – Material Transactions and Quick Clock. Using the Odyssey App for material transactions and Quick Clock has distinct advantages over using Odyssey Mobile or Odyssey Shop Floor Manager. Leveraging the power of the Odyssey API, the Odyssey App is lightweight and extremely responsive. It can be rolled out to nearly any modern device, and it can use that device's human interfaces to scan badges or barcodes. If you are currently using the Quick Clock through Odyssey's Shop Floor Manager, I encourage you to switch over to use the Odyssey App version. B&L Professional Services is ready to assist in any way they can.

Integrating with other applications is no longer a feature but an expectation. This integration is called an Application Programming Interface or API. Odyssey has had a version of an API for many years. First released as Odyssey Open Data (OOD), this API used a technology called SOAP. This is an older technology replaced by our RESTful API. Although the SOAP version is considered a legacy API, it will still be available for the foreseeable future. Moving forward from 6.4.0, the RESTful version of the Odyssey API will continue to be enhanced, while the SOAP version will not. If you are currently using the SOAP version, it is time to start looking at the RESTful version of the Odyssey API. One of the first enhancements we will add for 6.4.1 will allow the API to do a purchase order receipt. This new addition to the API will enable third-party applications to do purchase order receipts seamlessly.

B&L is starting 2022 with a brand-new release of Odyssey, Odyssey version 6.4.0. This version is the first of three scheduled 2022 releases, with 6.4.1 planned for release in May and 6.4.2 planned for release in September. The B&L Cloud is scheduled to be updated in February (6.4.0), June (6.4.1), and October (6.4.2) this year. The change from four releases a year to three releases a year hits a sweet spot that allows B&L to release new features regularly without causing too much downtime for our customers. Each release will not only include performance and stability fixes but will add new and exciting features to allow your business to make better decisions faster.

R&D's mission is not just to write code but also to build and support powerful business applications that help the metalcasting industry run a successful and efficient business.
